### What Is Accident Reconstruction?

Accident reconstruction is the scientific process of analyzing evidence from a crash to determine the events that caused it. While this is valuable in any motor vehicle case, it is especially critical in truck accidents, where the vehicles are heavier, the forces are greater, and the causes are often more complex.

Reconstruction combines:

- Physical evidence from the scene
- Vehicle data (including [black box](#) downloads)
- Witness statements
- Engineering and physics principles
- Specialized computer modeling

The goal is to create a clear and accurate timeline of the crash, from the truck's speed and braking to the driver's actions and the mechanical condition of the vehicle.

### **4. Maintenance and Inspection Records**

If a [mechanical failure](#) played a role, these records can show whether the truck was serviced properly or if the company neglected necessary repairs.

### **5. Driver Logs and GPS Data**

[Federal regulations](#) limit driving hours to reduce fatigue. GPS and logbook data can reveal if the driver [violated hours-of-service rules](#).

## **How Accident Reconstruction Works Step-by-Step**

### **Step 1: Immediate Evidence Preservation**
