Illegal U-Turns and Georgia Law: What Makes a Turn "Illegal"?

In Georgia, U-turns are generally permitted unless there's a posted sign prohibiting them, or the turn can't be made safely without interfering with other traffic. For truck drivers operating large commercial vehicles, those rules carry even more weight.

According to [Georgia traffic law \(O.C.G.A. § 40-6-121\)](#), U-turns become illegal when:

- They interfere with approaching traffic
- They are made where prohibited by signage
- They are performed on curves, near the crest of a hill, or in locations with poor visibility
- The vehicle cannot complete the turn without backing up or obstructing lanes

When a passenger vehicle makes a bad U-turn, it's dangerous. But when a fully loaded 80,000-pound truck does it, the consequences are far more severe. These massive vehicles take longer to maneuver, have larger blind spots, and can block entire roadways while attempting wide turns. Even a "legal" U-turn can become unlawful if done in a reckless or unsafe way.

Why Do Truck Drivers Attempt Risky U-Turns in the First Place?

Truck drivers are under immense pressure to stay on schedule. Delivery deadlines, GPS errors, missed turns, and lack of route familiarity can all contribute to a decision to make a U-turn, whether it's legal or not. Whatever the reason, the result is the same: a massive vehicle obstructing a roadway with little time for other drivers to react.

How Do Illegal U-Turns by Trucks Cause Serious and Fatal Accidents?

A truck blocking a road while executing a U-turn creates a deadly scenario, especially at night or in low-visibility conditions. Common types of crashes include:

- **[Underride Accidents](#):** A car crashes into the side of a truck and slides underneath, often shearing off the top of the vehicle.
- **[T-Bone Collisions](#):** A driver collides with the side of the truck mid-turn, resulting in severe injuries or fatalities.
- **[Multi-Vehicle Pileups](#):** Sudden stops or swerves to avoid a turning truck can cause chain-reaction crashes behind the initial impact.
- **[Rear-End Collisions](#):** If the truck stops mid-turn across a lane and oncoming traffic doesn't expect it, rear-end crashes can occur.

These crashes are rarely "minor." Victims often suffer from catastrophic injuries like [traumatic brain injuries](#), [spinal cord damage](#), broken bones, internal injuries, or [wrongful death](#).

Who's Liable in a Truck U-Turn Accident in Georgia?
