## How Truck Crashes Injure Children in Georgia

Children are physically smaller, more fragile, and less able to protect themselves in the event of a collision with any vehicle, let alone heavy semi-truck or tractor-trailer. As a result, they're more likely to suffer serious injuries in truck crashes, even at lower speeds.

Some of the most common scenarios involving children and trucks include:

- [Rear-end collisions](#) where a truck slams into a car carrying a child in the back seat
- [School zone crashes](#) caused by speeding or distracted truck drivers
- Crosswalk accidents where drivers fail to see or stop for children on foot
- Driveway and residential incidents involving package delivery trucks
- [Bicycle](#) or scooter collisions with commercial vehicles on neighborhood roads

Unlike adults, children may not understand traffic signals or danger cues as clearly. Truck drivers have a duty to operate their vehicles with extra caution in areas where children are likely to be present (especially in school zones, neighborhoods, parks, and near school bus stops). When that duty is violated, the consequences are often permanent.

## The Most Common Injuries Children Suffer in Truck Crashes

In our experience handling Georgia truck accident cases, the injuries children sustain are often more severe and lasting than those of adults. These can include:

- [Traumatic Brain Injuries \(TBI\)](#): Even a minor blow to a child's head can result in developmental delays or lifelong disability.

### **Georgia Trucking Dangers Near Schools and Residential Zones**

Many families don't realize how often large trucks travel through residential neighborhoods and school zones. In metro Atlanta and other Georgia cities, routes like Buford Highway, I-285,

Highway 78, and local bypasses see heavy truck traffic, sometimes just feet away from where children walk, bike, or wait for the school bus.

Risk factors that make these areas especially dangerous include:

- **[Blind Spots](#)**: Truck drivers may not see children crossing in front of or beside the vehicle.
- **[Wide Turns](#)**: These can easily catch a bicyclist or pedestrian in the wrong place.
- **[High Speeds](#)**: Even a few miles over the limit drastically increases stopping distance.
- **[Distracted Driving](#)**: Texting, GPS use, or eating behind the wheel puts everyone at risk.
- **[Fatigue](#)**: Long-haul drivers may be too tired to react in time to avoid a child.

While Georgia has regulations for school bus safety and reduced speeds in school zones, not every driver follows the rules, and not every trucking company screens drivers properly. If a company [hired an unqualified or dangerous driver](#), failed to maintain the truck, or forced unrealistic delivery schedules, they may be legally responsible for the crash.
