## **How Wrong-Way Accidents Happen in Georgia**

Wrong-way driving isn't just a small mistake. It's usually the result of serious negligence or impaired judgment. On Georgia roads, wrong-way collisions most often occur:

- At Highway Exits: A driver mistakenly enters an off-ramp instead of an on-ramp, heading directly into high-speed traffic.
- **At Divided Highway Crossings:** Confused or <u>intoxicated drivers</u> sometimes turn across medians or into opposing lanes.
- On Rural Roads: Poor lighting, missing signage, or fatigue can cause drivers to drift into oncoming lanes.

Most wrong-way crashes happen at night or during early morning hours, when visibility is low and driver impairment is more likely. Alcohol, drugs, or fatigue often play a central role.

A typical wrong-way collision involves a head-on impact at high speed, making these some of the most violent crashes on record. Unlike rear-end or sideswipe collisions, there's little time to brake or swerve before impact, leaving both drivers and passengers with severe, often fatal injuries.

## **Common Causes of Wrong-Way Crashes**

While no two crashes are identical, patterns emerge in nearly every investigation. Wrong-way accidents in Georgia often involve:

• Impaired Driving: Most wrong-way drivers are under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Impairment slows reaction time and clouds judgment, making it far more likely a driver will misinterpret road signs or drift into the wrong lane.

- <u>Distracted Driving:</u> Looking at a phone, GPS, or even in-car displays for just a few seconds can cause a driver to miss crucial directional signs. On multi-lane highways, that mistake can be deadly.
- <u>Fatigue and Drowsy Driving:</u> A tired driver can experience "micro-sleep" episodes—seconds-long lapses where they completely lose awareness. On an unlit rural road, that's long enough to cross into oncoming traffic.
- **Poor Road Design or Signage:** Some Georgia intersections and ramps still lack clear signage, lighting, or road markings. Drivers unfamiliar with an area may make a wrong turn, especially in bad weather or at night.
- Medical Emergencies: In rare cases, a medical episode—such as a stroke or seizure—can
  cause a driver to lose control and veer into opposing lanes.

## The Consequences of Wrong Way Crashes Are Often Tragic

Wrong-way crashes make up a small percentage of overall traffic accidents but cause a disproportionate number of fatalities.

These accidents frequently involve:

- Severe traumatic brain injuries (TBI) from the violent deceleration forces
- Spinal cord injuries leading to paralysis or long-term mobility loss
- Internal organ damage and fractures requiring emergency surgery
- Catastrophic burns from post-impact fires or explosions
- Wrongful death, often involving multiple victims in one incident

When survivors do make it through, their path to recovery can take years. Many face extensive rehabilitation, permanent disabilities, or emotional trauma that lasts a lifetime.

# **Comparative Negligence and Georgia Law**

Georgia follows a <u>modified comparative negligence rule</u>, which means your compensation can be reduced if you're found partially at fault for a crash. However, in wrong-way collisions, the other driver's negligence is usually overwhelming.

For example, if a drunk driver entered I-85 heading the wrong direction, they're nearly always deemed the primary cause of the crash. Even so, insurers may still try to assign a small percentage of fault to the victim to minimize payouts.

- **Median Barriers:** Concrete or cable dividers that prevent crossovers on high-speed roads.
- **Public Education Campaigns:** Continued outreach about the dangers of drunk, drugged, and distracted driving.
- **Technological Detection Systems:** Early-warning systems that notify police when a vehicle travels the wrong way.
