### Understanding What Counts as a Commercial Vehicle

Not every large vehicle on Georgia roads is considered a "commercial vehicle," but the distinction matters in wrongful death claims. A commercial vehicle is typically owned or operated by a business and used for transporting goods, materials, or passengers for hire. These vehicles include:

- Tractor-trailers and semi-trucks
- Delivery vans and box trucks
- Utility and construction vehicles

- If none of the above, the estate's representative

Importantly, Georgia law allows families to recover the “full value of life” from the perspective of the person who passed away, not simply what others lost. That concept reflects the state’s belief that every life has inherent worth beyond financial metrics.
