### What Are Secondary Collisions?

A secondary collision occurs when a vehicle that's already been involved in a crash is struck again; either by another vehicle, a fixed object, or internal movement within the car. These crashes can play out in seconds and are common on Georgia's congested highways and intersections.

Think of it like a row of dominoes. Once the first one falls, the momentum carries through everything in its path. In traffic, that momentum translates into tons of steel moving at high speed, which is a deadly equation that can lead to [catastrophic injury or death](#).

Secondary collisions can involve:

- **Chain-Reaction Pileups:** Multiple cars [rear-ending one another](#), often in fog, rain, or stop-and-go traffic.
- **Multi-Vehicle Highway Accidents:** A semi-truck or SUV pushing smaller cars into oncoming lanes or median barriers.
- **Rebound Crashes:** A car ricochets off a barrier or another vehicle and is hit again by cross-traffic.
- **Fixed Object Impacts:** After the first hit, vehicles spin into guardrails, trees, or road signs.

These scenarios create some of the most complex cases we handle because liability often shifts between several drivers, and sometimes even between drivers and commercial entities.

## Why Secondary Impacts Cause Such Severe Injuries

Every collision transfers energy through the body. When multiple impacts occur, that energy compounds, magnifying injuries even at lower speeds. The second or third crash often happens when victims are least able to brace or protect themselves.

Common injuries from multi-impact crashes include:

- **Traumatic Brain Injuries (TBIs):** Repeated jolts can cause [concussions](#) or diffuse axonal injuries even without direct head contact.
- **Spinal Cord and Disc Injuries:** The whiplash motion from multiple hits can compress vertebrae or rupture [spinal discs](#).
- **Internal Organ Damage:** Secondary impacts can shift [seatbelts](#), steering columns, or airbags, leading to blunt force trauma.
- **Psychological Trauma:** Victims often suffer post-traumatic stress, nightmares, or panic attacks long after the wreck.

- **Commercial Carriers:** Trucking or delivery companies whose drivers violated safety regulations.

- **Municipal Entities:** If poor road design or missing signage contributed to the crash.
